



PM Modi Sends Best Wishes To Joe Biden After Aggressive Prostate Cancer Diagnosis

(Gns). Following the announcement that former US President Joe Biden had been diagnosed with an aggressive form of prostate cancer that had spread to his bones, Prime Minister Narendra Modi sent his warmest regards for a speedy recovery.

Prime Minister Modi said, "Very concerned to hear about Joe Biden's health," in a message that was shared on X. Send him our warmest regards for a speedy and complete recovery. We are thinking of Dr. Jill Biden and her family.

After Biden reported worsening urine symptoms, a prostate nodule was discovered, leading to the

diagnosis, according to an official statement from his office. A high-grade malignancy with a Gleason score of 9 (Grade Group 5), which indicates that the disease has migrated to the bone, was confirmed by medical testing.

"A prostate nodule was found during President Joe Biden's evaluation last week after he began exhibiting worsening urine problems. He received a prostate cancer diagnosis on Friday, May 16, with a Gleason score of nine and signs of bone metastases, according to the statement.

The malignancy is said to be hormone-sensitive, which enables potentially successful therapy despite the gravity of the diagnosis.



In order to determine the best course of therapy going ahead, the 82-year-old former president and his family are currently seeking advice from medical experts.

"The cancer seems to be hormone-sensitive,

which enables effective management, even though this is a more aggressive form of the disease," the statement continued. "The President is discussing treatment options with his doctors and his family."

Meanwhile, on May 20, CNN's Jake Tapper and Axios' Alex Thompson will publish their new book, "Original Sin: President Biden's Decline, Its Cover-Up, and His Disastrous Choice to Run Again." The existing OCI Services portal was developed in 2013 and is currently operational in over 180 Indian missions abroad as well as 12 Foreigners Regional Registration Offices (FRROs), processing approximately 2000 applications per day. Given the significant technological advancements over the past decade and feedback received from OCI cardholders, a revamped OCI portal has been developed to address existing limitations and enhance user experience.

BSP Chief Mayawati Reappoints Nephew Akash Anand As Chief National Coordinator Months After Sacking Him

(Gns). Bahujan Samaj Party (BSP) chief Mayawati on Sunday appointed her nephew Akash Anand as chief national coordinator, a few months after sacking her from all positions in the party. This reappointment is said to be a significant move as BSP is aiming to find its ground in Uttar Pradesh ahead of 2027's assembly elections.

This appointment was made during a national-level meeting held at the Central Office on Lodhi Road, Delhi, which saw the attendance of party officials representing various states across India.

Notably, the assembly included district presidents and coordinators from Uttar Pradesh, alongside nation-

al coordinators, general secretaries, and state presidents.



This decision comes after Akash Anand's previous expulsion on March 3, under circumstances that highlighted internal party dynamics, including the influence of his father-in-law, Ashok Siddharth. Mayawati, at the time, had

emphasized that the move was in the best interest of the party and its founda-

tion to the party on April 13.

Mayawati's decision to reappoint Akash Anand underscores a renewed trust in his capabilities to lead and strengthen the BSP across the nation. In her address, she highlighted the need for Akash to operate with diligence and caution, aiming to bolster both the party's influence and its underlying movement. This move also signifies a potential succession plan, as Akash had previously been identified by Mayawati as her political heir before his temporary removal from the party.

During the meeting, Mayawati's message was clear: Akash Anand should remain uninfluenced by external parties and focus on his duties.

The Union Government is actively developing key infrastructure projects along NW2 (Brahmaputra) and NW16 (Barak), including the construction of passenger vessels of various capacities, terminal facilities, and capacity-building initiatives. Union Minister Shri Sarbananda Sonowal also reviewed progress on the proposed Inland Water Transport (IWT) project at Doyang Lake, and assessed the potential of Noune and Shilloi Lakes in Nagaland for water sports and tourism.

Rajnath Singh to visit Gujarat's Bhuj airbase today

Defence Minister Rajnath Singh is set to visit the Bhuj airbase in Gujarat for a two-day visit on Friday.

(Gns). During his visit, Singh is expected to evaluate the operational preparedness of the Indian Armed Forces in the region and examine the effectiveness of strengthened security measures following Pakistan's recent unsuccessful drone incursions.

Several operations, including Operation Sindoor, were led by the Western Air Command,

Haryana, Delhi, and Western Uttar Pradesh.

This region includes some of the most sensitive borders and forward airbases, making it the nerve centre for any aerial military action involving Pakistan.

Rajnath Singh recently reviewed the security situation along India's western border. The border areas of Rajasthan and Gujarat, which lie adjacent to Pakistan, are part of the western frontier.

The security review meeting, which focused on the safety of the nation's borders, was attended by the Chief of Defence Staff (CDS), the Army and Navy Chiefs, and senior officials.

According to the Ministry of Defence, the meeting held on Tuesday in New Delhi discussed the security situation on the western borders.

The meeting, chaired by Defence Minister Rajnath Singh, provided detailed information regarding the Line of Control (LoC) and the international border with Pakistan.

ANOTHER STALEMATE?

Ukraine, and Russia, After more than three years of brutal conflict, the promise of peace in Ukraine still hangs precariously in the balance. Diplomatic efforts are once again underway, this time in Istanbul, where representatives from Ukraine, Russia, the United States, and Turkey have met. Yet the absence of senior leadership ~ most notably the Russian and American presidents ~ raises serious doubts about the credibility and potential outcomes of these negotiations.

It has become increasingly clear that the road to peace in Ukraine runs not merely through diplomatic channels, but through the direct involvement of top leaders who command both the authority and political capital to make decisive moves. In this context, any negotiations lacking the presence of figures like Presidents Vladimir Putin and Donald Trump ~ who have each shaped their nations' foreign policy landscapes in profound ways ~ are likely to achieve little more than symbolic value.

The problem is not simply about protocol or diplomatic stature; it is about the mismatch between the gravity of the crisis and the level of engagement it is receiving. Ukraine continues to bleed, with ongoing military offensives and shifting frontlines. Russia, meanwhile, remains entrenched, controlling around 20 per cent of Ukrainian territory. These are not conditions ripe for incremental diplomacy. They demand bold, top-level political intervention. Ukraine's president, for his part, has expressed a willingness to meet his Russian counterpart directly. But Moscow's delegation, led by lower-ranking officials, sends a message of disengagement, if not outright disdain. This decision has also been interpreted as a slight against Turkey's mediation efforts and the broader international community's desire for a credible peace process.

The United States remains a pivotal actor. While officially represented at the talks, the absence of its top leadership underscores a troubling ambivalence. Whether one agrees with Mr Trump's political style or not, his assertion that peace will require a personal meeting betweeen him and Mr Putin reflects a hard truth: peace often demands more than diplomacy ~ it demands direct confrontation of hard realities by those who hold real power. The optics of the Istanbul talks matter. When a war has cost tens of thousands of lives and displaced millions, sending mid-level negotiators signals detachment. Peace cannot be brokered by those without the mandate to concede or commit.

Diplomacy without consequence merely prolongs the illusion of progress. Symbolic meetings and staged summits will not end the war. What is needed is genuine negotiation underpinned by political courage, strategic compromise, and mutual recognition of human suffering. The Istanbul talks, in their current form, risk becoming yet another footnote in a long series of failed efforts if key actors continue to treat peace as a procedural matter rather than a moral imperative. Until the main architects sit face to face and reckon with the weight of their decisions, peace will remain elusive. In diplomacy, timing and presence are everything. And right now, the world is still waiting for both.

Beyond GDP: India's tryst with reforms

In a compelling conversation, noted economist Montek Singh Ahluwalia, one of the key architects of India's 1991 economic reforms, has shared his insights on India's policy transformations, ongoing economic challenges, and the road ahead. His reflections provide a rare glimpse into the behind-the-scenes decision-making that helped shape modern India's economic trajectory. Ahluwalia began by recalling the economic turmoil India faced in 1991, marked by a severe balance of payments crisis.

At the time, foreign exchange reserves had dwindled to a precarious level, and a radical shift in economic policies was the only way forward. The reforms that followed, including trade liberalization, delicensing of industries, and opening up to foreign investment, were a watershed moment in India's history. While the reforms were spearheaded by then Prime Minister P.V. Narasimha Rao and Finance Minister Dr. Manmohan Singh, Ahluwalia emphasized that their success lay in a collective effort. He dismissed claims that the World Bank and IMF dictated India's economic policies, clarifying that discussions on structural reforms had already been taking place within the government. The crisis merely acted as a catalyst, allowing long-pending reforms to materialize.

He also recounted how his policy paper, later dubbed the M Document, influenced the government's approach to economic restructuring. He highlighted that resistance to change existed even within the bureaucracy, but strong leadership and a strategic approach helped (Gns).

push reforms forward. Shifting focus to current economic challenges, Ahluwalia addressed India's fiscal health, particularly the rising debt-to-GDP ratio. While India's

public debt remains below that of many advanced economies, he cautioned that sustaining long-term growth requires a disciplined fiscal policy. He also discussed how government borrowings impact private investment, suggesting that a measured fiscal deficit is crucial to ensuring macroeconomic stability. Ahluwalia reflected on the evolving global trade landscape, particularly the increasing protectionism seen in the US and other developed economies. While globalization had initially benefited emerging economies like India, latest trends indicate a shift towards economic nationalism. He criticized the US's approach of imposing tariffs on allies and competitors alike, warning that such transactional policies create uncertainty in global trade. In stark contrast, the vast majority ~ especially those engaged in service sectors and small to medium scale manufacturing ~ grapple with a persistent culture of inefficiency, negligence, and disregard for quality, affecting not only our daily life but the national economic growth and productivity. This pervasive decline stems from historical oppression, complacency, and an ingrained tendency to accept mediocrity rather than challenge it. Centuries of foreign rule conditioned society to resign to fate, suppressing creativity and dynamism. Over time, precision faded, leaving behind a workforce that lacked motivation for perfection.

Instead of fostering corrective action, substandard work became normalized. Despite 76 years of independence, this mindset persists, especially in sectors lacking strict oversight. With over 15.67 per cent youth unemployment and 103.4 million classified as "NEET" (Not in Education, Employment, or Training), many are absorbed into small industrial and service sectors where poor work culture flourishes unchecked. This segment, where inadequate vocational training, lack of discipline, and disregard for accountability thrives, needs urgent intervention. It is here that the Government and the organized private sector must

decline in professionalism and lack of precision across various medium and small scale industries are:

- * Inadequate skill development. Training programmes are either insufficient or non-existent, leading to poor workmanship.
- * Disjointed education systems result in lack of standardization in skill-based training while language comprehension hinders efficiency. In most cases the technician learns by experiments and experience leaving him unfit for competing with quality products from corporate or established industries.

India Is Not a Dharmashala: Supreme Court Echoes Country's Struggle Amid Refugee Overload

(Gns). Let's begin with facts. India is grappling with a complex refugee crisis, primarily involving Rohingya Muslims from Myanmar and undocumented migrants from Bangladesh. The recent Supreme Court ruling with regards to a Sri Lankan refugee highlights the country's challenges in managing this influx. Supreme Court's Stance on Refugees On May 19, the Supreme Court dismissed a plea by a Sri Lankan Tamil national seeking to remain in India after serving a seven-year sentence under the Unlawful Activities (Prevention) Act. The court emphasised that India, with its population of 1.4 billion, cannot serve as a 'dharamshala'-a free shelter-for foreign nationals. This decision aligns with India's stance on not accommodating foreign nationals without proper legal grounds for residency. India hosts approxi-

mately 40,000 Rohingya refugees, many of whom are undocumented and reside in areas like Jammu, Hyderabad, Delhi and Nuh. The Indian government has expressed concerns over potential security threats posed by some Rohingya individuals, citing alleged links in anti-national activities. In 2017, the government initiated processes for their deportation, leading to legal challenges and scrutiny. The Supreme Court last week dismissed a plea alleging that over 40 Rohingya refugees, including women and children, were dumped in the Andaman Sea for deportation, calling the claims "fan-ciful ideas." A bench of Justices Surya Kant and N Kotiswar Singh questioned the authenticity of the materials submitted, suggesting they were based on unverified social media content. The court refused to stay further



deportations, noting similar relief had been denied earlier and that the allegations lacked substantiating evidence or verified documentation. Bangladeshi Migrants and Border Challenges India shares a porous border with Bangladesh, leading to significant undocumented migration over the years. While exact numbers are challenging to ascertain, estimates suggest millions of Bangladeshi nationals reside in India without legal documentation. This influx has strained resources and heightened security concerns, prompting measures like the National Register of Citizens (NRC) in Assam to identify and deport illegal

Foreign Secy Vikram Misri To Brief Parliamentary Panel Today On India-Pak Conflict, Op Sindoor

By Amit Vasudev Time Published: Monday, May 19, 2025, 10:39 [IST] Google Oneindia News Foreign Secretary Vikram Misri is set to brief the Shashi Tharoor-led Parliamentary Standing Committee on External Affairs today, May 19, regarding the recent India-Pakistan military conflict that followed the Pahalgam terror attack and Operation Sindoor. The multi-party panel has summoned Misri to provide insights on "current foreign policy developments concerning India and Pakistan."

This comes in the wake of Operation Sindoor, launched by Indian armed forces to avenge the Pahalgam terror incident and the subsequent military

escalation between the two nations. Both sides agreed to halt military operations on May 10.

This marks the first instance of a senior government official appearing before the committee to formally brief Parliament on developments following the April 22 terror strike in Pahalgam, Jammu and Kashmir, which claimed the lives of 26 individuals, predominantly tourists. On May 7, India conducted strikes under Operation Sindoor, targeting nine terrorist hubs in Pakistan and Pakistan-occupied Kashmir.

Following these events, Misri, along with Colonel

Soya Qureshi and Wing Commander Vyomika Singh, addressed the media.

The Indian Foreign



Service (IFS) officer, who has been praised for his diplomatic outreach, faced online criticism after announcing the ceasefire on 10 May. Besides Committee Chair Shashi Tharoor, the 31-member panel includes prominent MPs such as Ravi Shankar Prasad and

Sudhanshu Trivedi (BJP), Deepender Hooda (Congress), Abhishek Banerjee (Trinamool Congress), Asaduddin Owaisi (AIMIM), and John Brittas (CPI-M).

Parliamentarians are expected to question Misri about the government's diplomatic efforts post-Pahalgam attack.

Interestingly, US President Donald Trump has claimed credit for brokering the ceasefire, citing his role in mediation and leveraging trade to bring both countries to the negotiating table.

Misri is also expected to inform the committee about India's plans to dispatch seven delegations to 32 countries and the European Union over the next three weeks.

Bengaluru: Krutrim AI Engineer's Suicide Sparks Debate On Toxic Work Culture

(Gns). Almost a fortnight after the body of a 25-year-old machine learning engineer working at an AI firm was discovered in Bengaluru's Agara Lake, serious allegations have emerged on Reddit and in media reports, citing unnamed staff members, suggesting the engineer took his own life due to a toxic workplace culture and an exploitative manager.

The engineer, Nikhil Somwanshi, was found dead on 8 May. A First Information Report (FIR) was subsequently lodged to investigate the incident. Somwanshi had joined Krutrim, an artificial intelligence company owned by the ride-hailing platform Ola, in August 2024, shortly after earning his master's

degree from the Indian Institute of Science (IISc), Bengaluru. He was regarded as an exceptional student, graduating with a GPA of 9.30. Reports allege that Somwanshi had been burdened with the responsibilities of several former colleagues who had resigned, reportedly due to the behaviour of their US-based manager, Rajkiran Panuganti.

In a Reddit post, a user by the name 'Kirkawakutzo' claimed that Panuganti regularly used "traumatic" language with new hires, nurtured a hostile working environment, and was responsible for a wave of team resignations. A Krutrim spokesperson

said the company was "heartbroken by the loss" and is fully cooperating with the authorities. The spokesperson also stated that Somwanshi was on leave at the time of his death.



"He reached out to his manager on April 8, expressing that he needed rest, and was promptly granted personal time off. Later, on April 17, he shared that he was feeling better but would benefit from additional rest, and his leave was extended accordingly," the company said in an email statement. The Reddit user further alleged that the manager "continued to mistreat staff even after learning of the engineer's death."

Other Krutrim employees, speaking on condition of anonymity, described Panuganti as having a longstanding reputation for aggressive and demeaning conduct, frequently undermining junior staff and labelling them "incompetent."

A Business Standard report cited a former Krutrim employee who supported the allegations, stating they had resigned without another job offer due to "intense work pressure", and recalled "feeling suicidal."

The Financial Express quoted another ex-employee who had worked under Panuganti as saying: "Rajkiran has no people management skills. He shouts at employees and disappears."

Police Summon Agitating Teachers Over May 15 Clashes At Bikash Bhavan

(Gns). Police have issued summons to several teachers involved in the ongoing protests outside Bikash Bhavan, the headquarters of the West Bengal Education Department in Salt Lake, in connection with the violent clashes that erupted there on May 15. These teachers had lost their jobs following a recent Supreme Court verdict and have been demonstrating outside the building since Thursday.

According to an official, the Bidhannagar Police Commissionerate issued the summons on May 16. The notice accuses the summoned teachers of damaging government property, obstructing public servants from discharging their lawful duties, and

UK-Based Professor Nitasha Kaul's OCI Status Cancelled by Centre Over 'Anti-India Activities'

(Gns). An Indian-origin academic based in the UK, Professor Nitasha Kaul, has stated that the Government of India has revoked her Overseas Citizenship of India (OCI) status on the grounds of "indulging in anti-India activities". Kaul was deported from Bengaluru airport last year, just hours after her arrival.

On 18 May, Professor Kaul took to social media to share the official notice of her OCI cancellation. She included an image of a section of the letter issued by the Indian government. "IMPORTANT NOTE - I received a cancellation of my #OCI (Overseas Citizenship of #India) today after arriving home. A bad faith, vindictive, cruel

In a follow-up post, she recalled the incident from the previous year when she was deported shortly after arriving in Bengaluru. She described the episode as an affront to the Congress-led Karnataka government, which had invited her to speak.

"Denied entry to India for speaking on democratic & constitutional values. I was invited to a conference as (an) esteemed delegate by (the) Govt of Karnataka (Congress-ruled state) but (the) Centre refused me entry."

Shehzad The arrest forms part of a broader nationwide crackdown on individuals allegedly spying for Pakistani intelligence services, which has already seen several people detained, including social media influencers and YouTubers. According to a press statement issued by the ATS, Shehzad had been under surveillance after credible intelligence indicated his involvement in smuggling activities along the India-Pakistan border, allegedly under the protection of Pakistan's intelligence apparatus.

Nirav Modi Extradition Case: UK Judge Says 'High Risk Of Absconding'

(Gns). Nirav Modi's extradition from the UK to India has encountered another hurdle. A London High Court judge recently denied his bail request, citing a "confidential impediment" delaying his return to India. Modi faces charges of fraud and money laundering there. The judge expressed concerns that Modi might not surrender if released, highlighting a high risk of absconding. Justice Michael Fordham, during a hearing at the Royal Courts of Justice, reiterated these concerns. He noted substantial grounds for believing that the 54-year-old fugitive would flee if granted bail. Despite the judicial

process being otherwise complete, a "confidential" legal issue has stalled Modi's extradition. Confidential Proceedings and Legal Challenges The nature of this "legal reason," as described by Justice Fordham, is known only to Modi, his legal team, and the Home Office. It remains undisclosed to the Crown Prosecution Service (CPS), the Indian government, or the court. Nicholas Hearn, representing Indian authorities, acknowledged this impediment but stressed its confidentiality. Speculation suggests



this issue may relate to an asylum claim. Although it has been mentioned in previous hearings, it remains unconfirmed officially. Justice Fordham emphasized that this confidentiality limits what the court can assess regarding Modi's detention or potential release risks. Repeated Bail Attempts and Health Concerns Since his arrest in March 2019, Modi has been held at Thameside prison in London. He has unsuccessfully applied for bail at least seven times. His legal team argues that

prolonged pre-trial delays justify his release due to mental and physical health concerns and reports of threats in custody. The judge considered these arguments anew but concluded they do not outweigh the flight risk. Modi faces three criminal cases in India: a fraud case by CBI related to Punjab National Bank, an Enforcement Directorate case on laundering fraud proceeds, and another alleging witness tampering. Extradition Approval and Ongoing Delays In April 2021, then UK Home Secretary Priti Patel approved Modi's extradition after British courts found a prima facie case against him.
